### A Biblical Pattern for Giving

Selected Scriptures

#### 1. Giving before \_\_\_\_\_.

There was \_\_\_\_\_ giving in the Bible before Moses.  
(Gen. 41:34; 47:24)

There was \_\_\_\_\_ giving in the Bible before Moses.  
(Gen. 4:3-5; 14:18-20)

The word "tithe" simply means a tenth. It is a \_\_\_\_\_ word, not a religious word. And it is used sparingly in Genesis.

In Genesis, when there is required giving with a set amount, it is to a national entity as \_\_\_\_\_. When there is freewill giving directly to God, there is \_\_\_\_\_. It is whatever the giver wants to give.

#### 2. Giving from Moses to \_\_\_\_\_.

There was \_\_\_\_\_ giving under the Law of Moses.

- This was the basic tithe under the Law of Moses, and it was commonly called the Lord's tithe or the \_\_\_\_\_ tithe. (Lev. 27:30-33; Mal. 3:8)
- Here the Law requires another tithe, another 10%. This one was called the \_\_\_\_\_ Tithe. (Deut. 14:22-23)
- This tithe, given every 3 years, was called the \_\_\_\_\_ Tithe. (Deut. 14:28-29)

There was \_\_\_\_\_ giving under the Law of Moses.  
(Prov. 3:9-10; Ex. 25:1-2; Deut. 16:16-17)

Required giving through the tithes \_\_\_\_\_ in the Old Testament was essentially taxation to fund the national entity, be it Egypt or Israel. Freewill giving in the Old Testament was \_\_\_\_\_ and to be given willingly, from the heart.

#### 3. Giving from Jesus to the \_\_\_\_\_.

There is \_\_\_\_\_ giving mentioned in the New Testament.  
(Mt. 22:15-22; 23:23; Luke 18:10-14; Rom.13:1-2; 6-7)

Jesus paid His \_\_\_\_\_ and told us that we are to pay ours as well.

So, just as in the Old Testament, required giving in the New Testament is \_\_\_\_\_ given to support the national entity, and we are still required to pay them.

There is \_\_\_\_\_ giving commanded in the New Testament.

- God wants us to give \_\_\_\_\_. (2 Cor. 9:6-7)
- God wants us to give to meet the \_\_\_\_\_ around us. (2 Cor. 9:8)
- God wants us to give \_\_\_\_\_. (2 Cor. 8:1-4)
- God wants us to expect His \_\_\_\_\_. (Luke 6:38)
