

**God Always Keeps His Promises**

Rom. 11:1-24

**1. God's rejection of Israel is only \_\_\_\_\_.** (vv. 1b-10)

- The \_\_\_\_\_ proves it. (v. 1b-2a)
- If a Jew with this pedigree and this level of zeal could be saved, \_\_\_\_\_ Jew could be saved.
- The \_\_\_\_\_ proves it. (vv. 2b-7a)
- God still had a remnant from among the Jews who had given their lives to \_\_\_\_\_.
- \_\_\_\_\_ from God's Word proves it. (vv. 8-10)
- God never hardens hearts that have not already repeatedly \_\_\_\_\_ Him.

**2. God's rejection of Israel is \_\_\_\_\_.** (vv. 11-24)

- But Israel's initial rejection of their Messiah didn't mean that God's choice of them as His people was \_\_\_\_\_.
- God had 3 purposes in allowing the Jews to temporarily stumble by rejecting their Messiah:
  - Their rejection has meant salvation for the \_\_\_\_\_, which is all of us (v. 11a).
  - The salvation of the Gentiles is meant by God and Paul to provoke the Jews to \_\_\_\_\_ (vv. 11b-14).
  - The reversal of their rejection will mean blessing for the whole \_\_\_\_\_ (v. 15).
- But the temporary rejection of the Jews is also a \_\_\_\_\_ to us. (vv. 16-24)
- We shouldn't get \_\_\_\_\_ because God is now blessing the church. The Jews are still His people.
- And we should be warned not to become \_\_\_\_\_. He can just as easily cut us off and graft in His own people again.
