tting to Know Me  Back in the day, which door-to-door salesmen came to your house? (Eg.: Fuller Brush, Avon, encyclopedia, etc.) How did your family react to them?
If you absolutely had to sell something door-to-door today, what would it be?
To the Bible  What one thing stood out to you in this week's sermon as something important to understand and apply?
There are a couple of interesting comparisons that Jesus uses in this passage. How are Christians like laborers in a harvest? How are Christians like lambs among wolves? What do you think Jesus is trying to say in these comparisons?
There is some disagreement today about whether Jesus' instructions to His disciples in vv. 4-9, where He gives them authority to heal including casting out demons (see vv. 17-20), are limited to just those 70 disciples on that specific occasion or if they are generalizable to all Christians, even us today. Compare this with Luke 22:31-38 before you answer. What would you say to this question?
Many modern translations set the number of disciples in this passage (v. 1) at 72 and some at 70. Why do you think this is? Is this an error in the Bible or a contradiction? Does this mean the Bible can't be trusted?
