

**1. Jesus gives us the gift of \_\_\_\_\_ . (vv. 21-24)**

This word in Greek has a \_\_\_\_\_ sense. (Matt. 27:53; Heb. 11:14)

And since He is speaking in the future tense, on the eve of His death, Jesus must mean that He will \_\_\_\_\_ to disclose Himself after His death and resurrection, and even after His ascension.

But He will do this only for those who \_\_\_\_\_ Him, that is, those who have His commandments and keep them.

How much is knowing Jesus worth? It's the most \_\_\_\_\_ gift there is.

**2. Jesus gives us the gift of the \_\_\_\_\_ in us. (vv. 25-26)**

This is the \_\_\_\_\_ time Jesus has promised the Holy Spirit this night. (vv. 16-17)

So while we think in terms of the Holy Spirit taking up residence in our hearts, and we're not wrong to do so, that is incomplete. It is in reality the whole Trinity who is living \_\_\_\_\_ as Christians.

Initially, Jesus made this promise for the sake of \_\_\_\_\_ His disciples.

But this promise is \_\_\_\_\_ important for us today, also.

This is a promise that extends to us. \_\_\_\_\_ is given the promise of the ever-present triune God living in us.

He will \_\_\_\_\_ us all things and \_\_\_\_\_ us of all that Jesus said. (1 John 2:20, 27)

So as we read and study the Bible, we have Jesus' \_\_\_\_\_ that the Holy Spirit, the Trinity in us, will teach us what we need to know about Jesus and following Him.

**3. Jesus give us His \_\_\_\_\_ . (vv. 27-31)**

This *shalom*/peace is not merely \_\_\_\_\_, an absence of trouble or conflict. It is also \_\_\_\_\_, speaking of completeness, contentment, welfare, health, harmony, and fulfillment.

The peace that Jesus gives is \_\_\_\_\_ external and internal.

Externally, Jesus is at peace \_\_\_\_\_ and gives that peace to us.

Internally, once we have peace with God, true internal peace becomes possible. This is not peace \_\_\_\_\_ God but the peace \_\_\_\_\_ God. (Phil. 4:7)

Jesus also shows us that we can also have peace in the face of \_\_\_\_\_.

Discussion Questions for the week of March 8, 2026

**Getting to Know Me**

- Who was the best teacher you ever had in school? What made them so special?
  
- Without naming names, what is the longest you've ever had house guests living with you, or been house guests yourself? How did it go? How did you feel when they/you left?

**Into the Bible**

- What one thing stood out to you in this week's sermon as something important to understand and apply?
  
- Notice that Jesus repeated the command to love Him by keeping His commandments 4 times in the near context (vv. 15, 21, 23, 24) Why do you think Jesus repeated this command so many times? What makes it so important? How does v. 31 relate to this?
  
- Compare vv. 16-17 with v. 26. What do we learn from these two mentions of the Holy Spirit about who He is, where He comes from, where He abides now, and what His ministry to us is?
  
- Why did the disciples need to *stop* letting their hearts be troubled (vv. 1, 27)? How does Jesus' gift of peace/*shalom* help us to be at peace both externally and internally? (See Phil. 4:7)
  
- Since Satan had no claim against Jesus and no power over Him (v. 30), why did He have to die? (See John 3:16; Rom. 5:8-10; 1 Pet. 2:24-25; Isaiah 53:5; 2 Cor. 5:21)

**Application**

- How do you think Jesus continues to disclose Himself to us today? What part do we play in that?
  
- How does it encourage you to know that the whole Trinity (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit) lives in you, as a believer?
